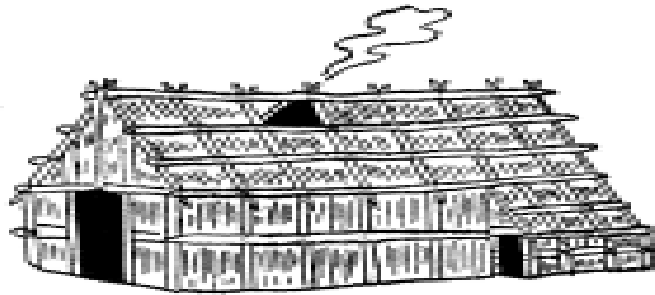

## TRAINING SESSIONS:

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This year at conclave, we continued with the university style training system. Allohakasin University was created by our Council of Chiefs at the 2003 conclave to add a new twist to the traditional conclave training. We created five colleges to major in; by attending two of three sessions from a chosen college and one session from any college, you could a degree. A General Studies degree could also be obtained by attending any three training sessions, no matter what college they were from. On Sunday morning, participants were presented with a diploma and patch if they met the requirements.

This program was highly successful this year with many participants returning to earn a Bachelor's Degree. A total of 132 degrees were presented. 74 Associate degrees were earned and 58 people returned to earn a Bachelor's degree. Next year, the Masters degree will be available to those who have Bachelor's standing. Trainers - professors - also receive a special edition of this patch and their own diploma. This year over 25 trainers received their special distinction during the Business Meeting.

## **COMMENTS:**

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### **Areas Needing Improvement:**

**Training:** Overall, training went well. However, there were two problems with training this year. First, many of the trainers in the first session did not have the materials they requested. The CVC needs to ensure everything is distributed to the training sites on time, because several trainers had problems in the first session. Secondly, all attendance figures can't be tracked by Section Master. Someone needs to go to each session and take down attendance, broken between youth and adult.

**Spirit:** There was a lack of lodge spirit for the most part. Only a couple of the lodges were enthusiastic and displayed large amounts of cheerfulness and spirit.

**Recreation:** There was not a lot of participation in the afternoon recreational games. Two possible remedies are centralizing the locations, so everything is in one place and having better promotions and sign-ups Friday night and Saturday.

**Shows:** The shows were decent, but could use a little improvement. Overall consensus was the closing show was good, but needed more rehearsal.

### **Outstanding Areas:**

**Registration:** Registration smoothed very well this year as compared to previous years. Having a pre-made packet for each participant, and allowing individual registration as opposed to lodge registration, made it possible for contingents to arrive at different times and participants still able to get their packets.

**AIA Village:** The American Indian Village located at camp provided a unique and very effective program at conclave. Many participants toured the Village and it cured the problems we had last year in this area.

**Section Master:** Again this year the uses of Section Master were quite rewarding. The ID badges, registration data, training info, and other database tools made the office aspect easy to run.

**Office Manager:** Adding the position of Office Manager proved very beneficial. The needs for all CVC's were coordinated in one central location and all the office type duties were assigned to one set person.

**Training:** Training went very well again, with over 85% of participants attending sessions. The University style training was very effective again.
